## FIRST KOROR STATE LEGISLATURE

NINTH REGULAR SESSION, JANUARY 1988

## AN ACT

To provide for a period of curfew hours and sale of alcoholic beverages within Koror State and for other purposes:

THE PEOPLE OF KOROR REPRESENTED IN THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF KOROR, DO ENACT AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. LEGISLATIVE FINDING.

The Legislature finds that it is in the public interest to specify certain period for peace, rest, and stability within one day in Koror State so that, individual citizens and businesses can plan- and coordinate their activities accordingly.

SECTION 2. CURFEW PERIOD.

There shall be no pedestrian or vehicle traffic on road of Koror State between twelve (12) O'clock (midnight) and six O'clock in the morning (6:00 a.m.) which shall be known as curfew hours from Monday to Friday and from 2:00am to 6:00 a.m. on Saturday, Sunday, and legal holiday except in the following situations.

a. Emergency affecting health or danger to persons and property.

b. Going to and from work, funeral, fishing, and religious service.SECTION 3. ALCOHOLIC SALE HOURS.

There shall be no sale of alcoholic beverages within Koror State between twelve O'clock (12 midnight) and six O'clock (6:00 a.m.) in the morning from Monday to Friday and from 2:00 a.m. to 6:00 a.m. on Saturday, Sunday, and Legal holiday.

SECTION 4. LIFTING OF CURFEW AND ALCOHOLIC SALE HOURS.

Curfew hours and alcoholic sale hours as set forth under Sections 2 and 3, can be suspended only for single day by a resolution approved by Koror State Legislature and the House of Traditional Leaders.

SECTION 5. PENALTIES, ENFORCEMENT.

a. Every person or business who violates any section of this act, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and shall pay a fine of \$20.0.0 for the first offense, \$30.00 for the second offense, \$40.00 for the third offense.

b. After third offense, the violator shall be imprisoned for 30 days or fined of no less than \$50.00 or both.

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(Passed as Bill No. 68 )

c. Law enforcement officers are' hereby authorized to close any business violating Section 3 of this act in' addition to penalties. under subsections a and b above, on a violation of each occasion.

d. In the event of duplication or conflict of penalties provided under national laws, penalties under this section, shall be waived.SECTION 6. REGULATIONS.

In executing this Act, the Administrator is hereby empowered to issue necessary regulations.

## SECTION 7. REPEAL.

Upon effective date of this Act, Koror Public, Laws Nos. 2, 21-62, 186-81 and K1-23-87 are hereby repealed.

SECTION 8. SEVERABILITY

In the event that any provisions of this Act is determined to be invalid by any court of competent jurisdiction, all other parts shall remain in effect. SECTION 9. EFFECTIVE DATE,

This Act shall take effect upon its approval by the House of Traditional Leaders or upon its becoming law without such approval.
